Artwork will be displayed for one month and subject matter must be "standard acceptable to the community".


Check out our first artist, Danny DiFilippo, during the month of March or stop by the Circulation Desk to learn more.

Be one of the lucky ones and get a jump start on these March titles!






The Stranger in the Woods by Michael Finkel is the remarkable true story of a man who lived alone in the woods of Maine for 27 years. **March 7**
