- 4. One typed 5-paragraph essay using <u>one</u> of the following speeches: "Give Us the Ballot" (1957), "The Other America" (1967), or "Beyond Vietnam: A Time to Break the Silence" (1967). These are inspiring speeches of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.
- 5. Return completed packet in one legal size envelope to:

Critical Essay Instructions

Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was a prophetic visionary. He addressed the social ills of his time and gave people hope for a better future. Write a coherent 5-paragraph essay using one of the selected speeches: "Give Us the Ballot" (1957), "The Other America" (1967), or "Beyond Vietnam: A Time to Break the Silence" (1967). In your essay, please address:

- How does this speech relate to current events of today?
- How can you apply Dr. King's legacy to a solution for today?
- How will you be a part of his legacy and/or solution?

What are some parallels between what you would like to speak to and what King addressed in his speech? What about your "cause" gives you the most hope? How will you use your voice and talents to alleviate today's social ills?

Your response must be a 5-paragraph essay, which should between 650 - 800 words long. This essay should include an introductory paragraph, three supporting paragraphs, and a concluding paragraph. The format is typed, double spaced, 1-inch margins, and 12-point Times New Roman or similar font.

Your answer should be thoughtful, complete, and conform to standard rules of grammar. Be mindful that the quality and coherence of your essay is a deciding factor for the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Scholarship Selection & Awards Committee.
